Marino Institute of Education explains how to obtain the SCG/OCG language requirement

Application forms for An Cháilíocht sa Ghaeilge (SCG/OCG) are currently available at: **www.ilrweb.ie**. Teachers who hope to undertake An Cháilíocht sa Ghaeilge in April 2024, are required to apply by 31 October 2023.

This article aims to provide candidates with information and guidance on the application process, routes to completion, important dates and available supports.

Is An Cháilíocht sa Ghaeilge for you?

An Cháilíocht sa Ghaeilge (SCG/OCG) is for primary teachers who obtained their primary teaching qualifications outside of the State and who, upon registration with the Teaching Council, have an 'Irish Condition' attached to their registration. To satisfy that condition, candidates must undertake and complete successfully the Irish Language Requirement (An Cháilíocht sa Ghaeilge).

Routes to completion

Candidates may select from one of two routes to completion: An Scrúdú le hAghaidh Cáilíochta sa Ghaeilge (SCG) or Oiriúnú le hAghaidh Cáilíochta sa Ghaeilge (OCG). The SCG route involves aptitude tests and the OCG route involves a school-based adaptation period and assessments.

There are important differences between SCG and OCG. Prospective applicants are advised to carefully consult the SCG Guide and the OCG Guide available at: www.ilrweb.ie. A brief comparison of the main aspects of both SCG and OCG is presented in table 1.

Support materials

Support materials for OCG candidates are provided in *Sruth na Maoile: Ábhar Tacaíochta d'Oiriúnú le hAghaidh Cáilíochta sa Ghaeilge* (Institiúid Oideachais Marino, 2009), and support materials for SCG candidates are provided in *Cóir Ghaoithe: Cúrsa Ullmhúcháin don Scrúdú le hAghaidh Cáilíochta sa Ghaeilge* (Institiúid Oideachais Marino, 2006, 2009). Both books may be used independently for self-directed learning or in a formal



course setting for tutor-directed learning. There is more information on available supports in tables 2, 3 and 4.

Courses

Courses are optional but it is highly recommended that a candidate would engage with a tutor or in a group course. Courses offer regular and consistent contact with tutors and other candidates. Courses normally begin in September or October. Enquire early with tutors/course providers to avoid disappointment. A list of tutors and course providers is available at: www.ilrweb.ie. All tutors have received training from Institiúid Oideachais Marino.

School visits

School visits to assess practical elements of the SCG and OCG will take place in the current academic year between 9 January 2024 and 9 February 2024. Candidates are asked to provide school details on application or by 30 November 2023. A supervisor will contact candidates in advance of each visit to agree and arrange a date and time. Full details on requirements for school visits are available in Cóir Ghaoithe: Cúrsa Ullmhúcháin don Scrúdú le hAghaidh Cáilíochta sa Ghaeilge and in Sruth na Maoile: Ábhar Tacaíochta d'Oiriúnú le hAghaidh Cáilíochta sa Ghaeilge.

Examinations and assessments

The SCG examinations and the OCG Assessments will take place in the Marino Institute of Education on 2, 3 and 4 April 2024. Full schedule details are available at: www.ilrweb.ie. A supplemental examination will take place on 22 and 23 August 2024.

Registering for An Cháilíocht sa Ghaeilge

Candidates wishing to undertake An Cháilíocht sa Ghaeilge during the 2023/24 academic year must register with Oifig na gCáilíochtaí Gaeilge (contact details below) by 31 October 2023. Early registration is advised. Registration allows a candidate to enter for the examination/assessment, to obtain access to the syllabus, to attain digital copies of support materials and it will also allow a candidate to provide school details which will be used to coordinate school visits.
