



AGROMETEOROLOGICAL BULLETIN

The Weather of March 1989

Summary

1st-16th: Unsettled, some very wet days; strong southwest airflow.
17th- 24th: Wet, rather cold and changeable; westerly winds.
25th - end: Less wet and mild; southerly winds.

Meteorological Situation

The Atlantic influence continued from February through March. Deep depressions were steered towards Iceland but occasional secondary centres approached this country. Strong southwest winds and frequent rainbelts prevailed. In particular, depression centres affected the country on 2nd, 6th, 12th and 14th while that on 16th passed through to the continent south of Ireland. Northwest airflows and showery conditions followed each of the centres apart from the 7th and 17th when the Azores high exerted greater influence. The latter ridge was followed by a westerly airflow and the spell proved to be particularly changeable, wet and windy to 24th; strong southwest to northwest winds prevailed during this time. A general backing of wind to a southerly direction then took place and this led to improved temperatures. However an Azores ridge extending over the country on 28th was followed by further unsettled conditions although winds eased gradually towards the end of the month.

Precipitation

Amounts were well above normal everywhere. Values varied from 235% of normal at Killarney to 109% at Dublin Airport. Rainfall was evenly spread throughout the month. Wettest days varied somewhat with region but at Birr, for example, they occurred on 2nd, 5th, 8/9th, 14th, 18th to 23rd and 27th.

Temperature

Mean air temperature was well above normal, varying from 1.4°C above at Dublin Airport to 0.1°C above at Belmullet. The mean maximum contributed most to the anomalies and was well above normal at Dublin Airport (2.1°C) whereas the mean minimum values deviated less from normal. In the changeable conditions frost occurred on a number of nights, the more prolonged period being 20th to 25th. Lowest air temperature of -7.3°C occurred at Ballinrobe on the 23rd and lowest ground temperature occurred at Grange on the 17th. Soil temperatures(100mm) were 1.0°C or less above average except in the period 16th to 25th when they tended to be below average.

Sunshine and Radiation

Hours of bright sunshine varied from 109% of normal at Clones to 74% at Cahirciveen. In general there was no particularly dull period. Global radiation varied from 105% of normal at Dublin Airport to 86% of normal at Valentia.

Wind

Winds were especially strong and gusty throughout much of the month, particularly in the period 19th to 24th. Other spells occurred on 5/6th, 8/9th, 12/13th. The number of days with gale gusts varied from 28 at Malin Head to 12 in the midwest stations.








Rainfall percentage of (1951-80) normals

Outlook for April 12th - 22nd

The Atlantic influence will dominate. Showers in west to northwest winds over the first few days, followed by a passing ridge, will give way by 14th/15th to an active depression system off the west of Ireland — some heavy rain and strong southwest winds will occur. A slacker airflow will set in towards the end of the period but the weather will remain unsettled.

Farming and Weather Forecasts

Farming has increasingly become a very technical and precise enterprise. A concern with profit margins, growth rates, weight gains , feed supplies, quota systems, agreed prices, work schedules, are all part of good farm management. For the most part, it may be said that the principal area of uncertainty remaining in farming now hinges upon weather, i.e.weather is the factor that makes farming difficult (after A.J. Brereton). The effects of weather may be direct, e.g. impact on growth , variability in production. interruptions caused to operations due to wet spells, setbacks arising from damaging storms; or the effects may be indirect, e.g. influences on diseases and the activity of parasites which require control while avoiding useless application. A flexible approach to management is essential. The farmer therefore has constantly to change decisions because of weather.

The most immediate requirement from the farmers' point of view is for a dependable weather forecast service, locally accurate and extending for a forecast period as long as possible. Within the constraints of present forecasting capabilities, in practice, requirements may range from just a few hours to four to seven days. However , more than most perhaps the longer range forecasts are extremely important to farming.

The weekly forecast is very useful for planning the week's work activity on the farm and for assessing the overall effect the weather will likely have on progress on many fronts. As specific tasks become due , e.g. spraying, fertilizer spreading, silage making, final decisions must be made on the basis of the most recent short range weather forecast.

Depending on the farming enterprise mix, many farmers have a need for weather forecasts throughout the year while others have a greater requirement at certain times for particular farm operations. In a survey carried out in 1985, 42% of farmers gave as their first choice the daily 24 hour forecast while 20% favoured 2 - day (48 hour) forecasts and 38% preferred 3-day (72 hour) or more ranges (Table 1(a)). With regard to preference for reception, 52% choose TV, 30% radio, 9% ATWS, 5% direct contact with the forecaster and 4% newspapers, agriline, etc. (Table 1(b)). The surprisingly high loading for radio follows from greater accessibility to radio in both cars and tractors and because the 7.55 a.m. forecast was considered to be very important. The recent improvement in television presentation , and in particular the innovation of a weekly forecast on this medium geared towards farming (at 1202 on Sundays), may have caused these percentages to change somewhat.
