

Oireachtas Update



In the Dáil on Tuesday and Wednesday, the Second Stage, Committee and Remaining Stages of the Thirty-fourth amendment of the Constitution (Marriage Equality) Bill 2015 are scheduled for consideration.

The Minister for Health, Leo Varadkar TD, will be making statements on ambulance services in Dublin to the Seanad on Tuesday. Also on Tuesday, the Minister of State with special responsibility for the Diaspora, Jimmy Deenihan TD, will be making statements on *Global Irish: Ireland's Diaspora Policy*.

The Joint Committee on European Affairs will hear on Tuesday from Conservative MEP Sir Bill Cash on the topic of 'BrExit'. The Joint Committee of Inquiry into the Banking Crisis will hear from Mr Simon Carswell of the Irish Times, on relationships between State authorities, political parties, elected representatives, supervisory authorities, banking institutions and the property sector.

Plain packaging legislation for tobacco products passed by Oireachtas

The Public Health (Standardised Packaging of Tobacco) Bill has passed through all stages of the Oireachtas. It was first passed by the Seanad, then debated in the Dáil where it was subject to some technical amendments, and last week returned to the Seanad to pass these final amendments. In effect, there will no longer be any cigarette marketing on packaging, allowing only for the name of the brand and a health warning to be printed on packets.

Ireland is the first European country to bring in such laws, and the second in the world, after Australia. The remaining option for cigarette companies opposing the legislation is to take the State to court.

Rural development advisory group established

An advisory group to advance rural development policy in Ireland and to assist in the implementation of the 34 recommendations of the Government's CEDRA report has been established. This group will be chaired by Pat Spillane, who also chaired CEDRA's (Commission for the Economic Development of Rural Areas) work in 2012 and 2013. Members of the new advisory group will include the MDs of Supermacs and Dairymaster – Pat McDonagh and Dr Edmund Harty – the CEO of Musgraves, Chris Martin, and Ear to the Ground Journalist, Helen Carroll.

The CEDRA report was completed in December 2012, published in November 2013, and launched in April 2014. In July 2014 Minister Ann Phelan was appointed as the Minister for Rural Affairs with special responsibility for rural economic and development and specifically the implementation of the CEDRA recommendations. Minister Phelan established an Interdepartmental Group, which she chairs, to support the delivery of the CEDRA recommendations.

Happenings at the Oireachtas Banking Inquiry

On March 4 2015 the Banking Inquiry Committee heard from Dr Peter Bacon and Professor Alan Ahearne. Dr Bacon spoke on reports he produced for the Department of Finance in 1998, 1999 and 2000, and on the establishment and operational effectiveness of NAMA. According to Dr Bacon, the measure with the most significant impact in the subsequent rise of house prices was the decision in 2001 to reverse the exclusion of tax deductions of interest for investors.

Professor Ahearne of NUI Galway spoke on issues relating to early warnings signs of a boom-and-bust cycle. He commented that Government intervention in 2004 to end excessive lending practices would have helped avoid the major damage caused in 2005 and 2006.

The Banking Inquiry will soon commence the media module as part of its Context hearings. Chairman of the Committee, Ciaran Lynch TD said: "On Wednesday 25th March, we will commence public hearings on the role of the media during the property boom in the lead-in to the banking crisis and any changes in approach after the crisis." The Committee will hear from former and current executives of Irish media outlets and from a number of media academics.

€2.7 million in grant-aid to seafood processing companies

On Friday the award of €2.7 million in grant-aid to 18 seafood processing companies under the 2015 Seafood Processing Business Investment Scheme was announced. Combined with private sector investment, this means that total investment in 2015 in the seafood processing industry will be close to €9 million. Grant aid is co-funded on a 50/50 basis by the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine, and the European Fisheries Fund under the Seafood Development Programme.

The 18 companies receiving grant aid are based in nine coastal counties; Clare, Cork, Donegal, Dublin, Galway, Kerry, Louth, Mayo and Wexford. Eligible costs for grant aid include new machinery and equipment, and the construction, extension or modernisation of seafood processing enterprises.
