DRY IN PLACES; ABOVE AVERAGE TEMPERATURES EVERYWHERE

Rainfall totals were variable across the country with percentage of Long-Term Average (LTA) values ranging from just 25% at Carrigans (Kildrum), Co Donegal (a monthly total of 16.2 mm) to 167% at Kenmare (Derreen), Co Kerry (a monthly total of 213.9 mm). The majority of stations around the country reported

wetter conditions in 2013. The month's wettest days were mainly the 2nd, 5th, 25th and 30th, with the month's wettest day on the 25th at Glencar (Dreenagh), Co Kerry with 50.6 mm. The wettest day of April was at Meelick (Victoria Lock), Co Offaly on the 30th with 28.0 mm, its highest for the month since 1947 and 2nd highest


Mean temperatures were above their LTA everywhere. Deviations from LTA ranged from 0.8°C at Sherkin Island, Co Cork (a monthly mean temperature of 10.3°C) to 2.6°C at Glenties Hatchery, Co Donegal (a monthly mean temperature of 10.8°C). Mean temperatures ranged between 9.3°C at Knock Airport, Co Mayo (1.8°C above its LTA) to 11.4°C at both

Ardtarmon, Co Sligo (2.4°C above its LTA) and Dooks, Co Kerry. The majority of highest air maxima were between the 27th and 29th, with the month's highest maxima of 21.0°C at Cavan (Drumconnick) on the 29th. Lowest minimum air and grass temperatures were mostly recorded between the 18th and the 20th, with the lowest air minimum recorded at Castleconnell, Co Limerick with -1.9°C on the 20th and lowest grass minimum of -6.8°C recorded at Piltown (Kildalton Agricultural College), Co Kilkenny on the 19th.


The majority of sunshine totals were above average. Percentage of LTA values ranged from 84% at Sherkin Island, Co Cork (total monthly sunshine 149.5 hours) to 118% at Dublin Airport (total monthly sunshine 185.9 hours). Daily mean sunshine ranged from 4.4 hours at Knock Airport, Co Mayo (92 % of its LTA and its dullest April since 2001) to 5.9 hours at Belmullet, Co Mayo (113% of its LTA). The sunniest day was the 29th at Shannon Airport, Co Clare with 13.6 hours. The number of dull days (days with less than 0.5 hours of sunshine) ranged from two a numerous stations to seven at Dungarvan (Carriglea), Co Waterford.

Wind and Elements


Monthly mean wind speeds ranged from 6.3 knots (12km/h) at Fermoy (Moore Park) and Mullingar to 13.9 knots (26km/h) at Malin Head. Valentia Observatory reported the month's highest gust of 56 knots (104km/h) on the 25th. Gale force winds (mean 10-minute wind speed of greater than 34 knots) were reported on the 6th and 25th along parts of the Atlantic coast, with the highest 10-minute wind speed of 35 knots (65 km/h) recorded at Malin Head on the 6th and at Sherkin Island on the 25th. There were no storm force winds (mean 10-minute wind speed of greater than 41 knots) reported this month. One report of snow at Dundalk (Annaskeagh Water Works), Co Louth on the 2nd. Fog was reported on 23 days across the country with thunderstorm activity was recorded on less than a third of the days. The severest thunderstorm activity was on the 27th, with one report of a funnel cloud on this date in the Cork area.



Upper Atmosphere wind and temperature readings are made at Valentia Observatory twice a day by a radiosonde (a balloon with instruments attached). Shown below are daily average wind speeds and temperatures at defined pressure levels, 850, 700, 500 and 300 hPa, corresponding approximately to heights of 1.5, 3, 6 and 10 km. Monthly wind roses are also shown for each pressure level.






Acid rain occurs when pollutants combine with moisture in the air to form sulphuric or nitric acid. pH is the simplest way of measuring the acidity of precipitation. Usually pH of 7.00 is considered neutral but this is not the case in rainfall samples. Pure water in the atmosphere has an equilibrium pH value of 5.65 at 20°C owing to carbon dioxide in the air dissolving to form carbonic acid. Any value below pH 5.65 is considered acid while any value above is considered alkaline.

Conductivity measures the total ion activity in the rainfall, i.e. the higher the conductivity the greater the number of ions.

Sulphur dioxide and sulphate in air contribute to the formation of sulphuric acid; nitrate in air contributes to the formation of nitric acid.

Tuesday April 1st: Heavy thunder and rain in the North died out overnight. Rain spread into the South during the afternoon, pushing, slowly, northwards. Warm and sunny in the Midlands and West, cooler and cloudier nearer to southern and eastern coasts. Winds were light to fresh, southerly. Rainfall: Nil at numerous locations to 26.5 mm at Glenvickee (Caragh River Area) Temperature: Lowest max. 9.9°C at Cork Apt, highest max. 17.8°C at Glenties Hatchery. Lowest min. 0.3°C at Castleconnell, highest min. 9.1°C at Valentia Obs Sunshine: 0.2 hours at Wexford Wildfowl Reserve to 11.3 hours at Belmullet

Wednesday April 2nd: Overnight rain and drizzle in many areas continued through the morning, though much of the North remained dry. Rain continued in the East for the rest of the day but cleared away from the Midlands by early evening. Winds were light southeasterly.

Rainfall: Nil at numerous locations to 20.1 mm at Tinahealy (Mucklagh)

Temperature: Lowest max. 9.7°C at Carrickmacross (Dunoge), highest max. 15.5°C at Killarney (Muckross Hse). Lowest min. 4.0°C at Delphi Lodge, highest min. 10.0°C at Dooks Sunshine: Nil at numerous locations to 4.4 hours at Valentia Obs

Wednesday April 9th: Patchy rain on western and northern coasts died out before midday leaving a generally dry day. There were some sunny breaks, the best in the East, but it remained mostly cloudy. Winds were moderate to fresh, west to southwest.

Rainfall: Nil at numerous locations to 6.6 mm at Dooncarton

Temperature: Lowest max. 11.7°C at Slieve Bloom Mtns (Nealstown), Fethard (Parsonshill), highest max. 15.5°C at Cahore (Kilmichael Hse), Cavan (Drumconnick). Lowest min. 2.1°C at Ballymore, highest min. 9.5°C at Dooks, Oughterard (Ardnasillagh)

Thursday April 10th: Rain in the North and Northwest overnight. The morning was generally dry, apart from some rain in western and northern areas. Rain affected eastern areas through the afternoon, but cleared in the West and North. The evening remained mostly dry with some sunny/clear spells. 
VARIABLE MONTHLY RAINFALL TOTALS

Rainfall totals were variable across the country with mainly above Long-Term Average (LTA) values in the southern half of the country. Percentage of LTA values were lowest in the Northwest from just 25% at Carrigans (Kildrum), Co Donegal. Carrigans reported its monthly total of 16.2 mm as April's lowest monthly accumulation and the stations driest April since it opened in 1997. Stations in parts of Donegal, Galway, Leitrim, Mayo and Sligo had their driest April on record (station observations starting up to 30 years ago). Other longer-term stations in the area like Glentornan (Lake Nabruckbaddy), Co Donegal, recorded a monthly total of 52.9 mm and had its 2nd driest April on available record since 1948. Percentage of LTA values were highest in parts of the South and Southwest, with up to 167% of LTA reported at Kenmare (Derreen), Co Kerry. Kenmare reported the month's highest rainfall total in a low-lying region (area below 200 m) with 213.9 mm. This was its wettest April in 9 years and the 7th wettest April at the station since it opened 74 years ago. The month's overall highest accumulation was at a gauge in the Cummeragh Mountains, Co Kerry with 224.8 mm, it wettest April since 2003. The majority of stations around the country reported wetter conditions in 2013. The month's wettest days were mainly the 2nd, 5th, 25th and 30th, with the overall wettest day reported at Glencar (Dreenagh) Co Kerry on the 25th with 50.6 mm.






DAILY 0901-0900hr RAINFALL VALUES (mm)




MEAN AIR TEMPERATURES ABOVE AVERAGE

All monthly mean air temperatures were above their Long-Term Average (LTA) with largest differences from average in the North and Northwest. Deviations from LTA ranged from 0.8°C at Sherkin Island Co Cork (a monthly mean temperature of 10.3°C) to 2.6°C at Glenties Hatchery, Co Donegal (a monthly mean temperature of 10.8°C). Monthly mean air temperatures ranged from 9.3°C at Knock Airport, Co Mayo (1.8°C above its LTA) to 11.4°C at both Ardtarmon, Co Sligo (2.4°C above its LTA) and Dooks, Co Kerry. All stations had higher mean air temperatures in 2011. Mean highest air maximum temperatures were all above their LTAs with differences of up to 3°C above normal in the Northwest at Glenties Hatchery. The majority of highest air maxima were between the 27th and 29th, with highest maxima ranging from 14.9°C at Johnstown Castle, Co Wexford to 21.0°C at Cavan (Drumconnick). Mean lowest air minimum temperatures were also all above their LTAs with differences up to 2.8°C above normal at Mallow (Spa Hse), Co Cork. Lowest air and grass minima were mainly between the 18th and 20th, with lowest air minima ranging from -1.9°C at Castleconnell, Co Limerick to 4.8°C at Ardtarmon, Co Sligo. The April lowest air minimum recorded at Waterford (Tycor) of 4.5°C was the highest during April at the station since



it opened in 1961. The lowest grass minimum was -6.8°C recorded at Piltown (Kildalton Agricultural College), Co Kilkenny. The number of days with air frost were zero at numerous locations to four at Dublin Airport. Ground frost was recorded at all stations with up to 15 days reported at Ashford (Cronykeery), Co Wicklow.








VARIABLE MONTHLY SUNSHINE TOTALS; HIGHEST DAILY SUNSHINE AT SHANNON AIRPORT


The majority of sunshine totals were above average with below average monthly totals in parts of West, Southwest, Southeast and North. Percentage of LTA values ranged from 84% at Sherkin Island, Co Cork (total monthly sunshine 149.5 hours), its dullest April since 1996 to 118% at Dublin Airport (total monthly sunshine 185.9 hours). Daily mean sunshine ranged from 4.4 hours at Knock Airport, Co Mayo (92 % of its LTA and its dullest April since 2001) to 6.2 hours at Dublin Airport (118% of its LTA). The sunniest day was the 29th at Shannon Airport, Co Clare with 13.6 hours of sunshine, equalling its highest on record since 1946.

Percentage of LTA Global Solar Radiation values were on or above average, with the highest at Malin Head, Co Donegal with 110%.










ATMOSPHERIC PRESSURE

Monthly mean sea level pressure values ranged from around 1012 hPa in the West and Southwest to just over 1013 hPa in the Southeast. The month's lowest pressure value of 979.4 hPa was recorded at Sherkin Island on the 26th at 0500 UTC as a depression of 978 hPa was located over Cork and Kerry before moving along the southern coast. The month's highest pressure value of 1029.1 hPa was recorded at Shannon Airport on the 14th at 1100 UTC as a high pressure system of 1029 hPa was situated over the whole country.






Between the 19th and 22nd in Romania, Serbia and
Bulgaria, heavy rains combined with melting snowpack led to the
flooding in parts. Several rivers overflowed their banks and roads were
cut off by landslides. At least four people were killed with hundreds
of homes were destroyed and with nearly 50,000 acres submerged by
flood waters.

Several severe weather outbreaks affected the

Severe thunderstorms between the 7th and the 9th affected China's Xinjiang, Guangxi, Yunnan, and Guizhou provinces. Large hail, strong gusts and flooding caused damage to residential property and agriculture. Luckily no serious injuries or fatalities were reported.

Several severe weather outbreaks affected the United States between the 2nd and 4th, 12th and 14th and 27th and May 1st. Tornadoes of up to EF-3 were reported as well as softball sized hail and flash flooding due to heavy rainfall. Over 50 people were killed during these events with cost of damage into billions of dollars.

A powerful storm heavily impacted the districts of Netrokona, Sunamganj, Tangail, and Naogaon in Bangladesh on the 27th and 28th. Strong winds killed at least 16 people, destroyed more than 1,000 tin and mud-built homes and uprooted trees and electricity poles.

Cyclone Ita affected the Solomon Islands, Papua New Guinea, Australia and New Zealand during the first two weeks of April. Cyclone Ita was first identified on April 1st and made landfall at Cape Flattery in Australia's northern Queensland on April 12th. Wind speeds (1-minute sustained winds) of up to 250 km/h were recorded along with a low pressure centre of 930 hPa. In the Solomon Islands, Ita caused flash flooding after 1000 mm of rain fell in over four days. Over 40 people were killed in the capital city Honiara when the river flowing through the city burst its banks.
